(x) Rhodesia Explorers Mail Dr. Emil Holub 1879 (29 Jul.) envelope to Dr. Francis J. Holub (Emil Holub's father) c/o Mr. Francis Novak in Prague, the envelope bearing Cape of Good Hope 1d. vertical pair and 6d. tied by barred oval '1' cancellations and with Cape Town c.d.s. below, Prague arrival c.d.s. on reverse; and 1882 (29 Jun.) Cape of Good Hope ½d. Newspaper wrapper also addressed to Dr. Emil Holub in Prague, 'Wien' c.d.s. on reverse; important and rare Holub items, the latter a recent discovery and both discussed in the RSC memorandum 274 of June 2019 Note: Dr Emil Holub developed an interest in natural history and geography and was much influenced by the writings of Livingstone. He graduated as a Doctor of Medicine from Prague University in February, 1872. Shortly afterwards he departed for Southern Africa and made his way to the diamond fields of Kimberley. Not a wealthy man, Holub set up a practice in a tent to help raise funds for a collecting expedition. He set out in March, 1875, planning to follow Livingstone's footsteps up the Zambesi River. It was on this expedition that he fell dangerously ill and was nursed back to health by the Coillards. Until recently, the only known cover of Holub from South Africa belonged to Brian Trotter. It is endorsed: From E Holub's Travel to the Interior Leshumo Valley for my Return from Sepopo to Pandamatenka 21 August 1875. 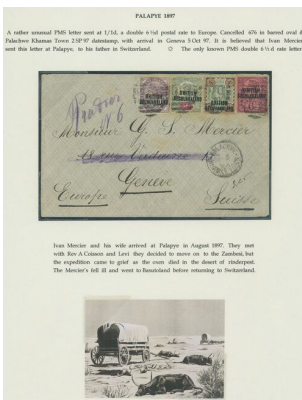

(26.9) alongside with Aliwal North (26.9), Cape Town (30.9), octagonal tax mark, Swiss 20c. postage due cancelled Neuchatel (22.10) c./d.s.; unfortunately much of the message has been lost. Also 1897 (29 July) C.G.H. 1d. on ½d. stationery card to Italy from Louis Jalla in New Vale, cancelled by an indistinct barred oval with Masero (30.8) Cape Town (2.9), Torino (26.9) and redirected to Capri (27.9) c.d.s.; the message reports the arrival of Mr Mercier and the voyage to Palapye. (x) Missionary Mail Barotseland Sefula (established 1886) Map 11894 (29 Oct.) envelope to France bearing British Bechuanaland ½d. and 1d. pair tied by "676" barred oval with "palachwe/khamas town" c.d.s. alongside, the reverse with Mafeking squared circle (6.11) and part Montpellier arrival c.d.s. (27.11). The envelope is initialled at foot "F.C." of Francois Coillard. Very fine and a highly important cover. Coillard was stationed at Sefula at this time. The P.M.S. mission had an arrangement with the officials in Palapye that their outgoing mail would have stamps affixed in Palapye and they would be charged accordingly. The missionaries initialled their covers accordingly so that subsequent reckoning could be made. Only ten of these letters have been recorded. For covers from Skesheke, see lot xxx and from Lealui, see lot xxxx Subject to 5% tax on Hammer Price in addition to 20% VAT on Buyer's Premium.

(14.4) with Annonay arrival (9.5) alongside; the reverse with Mafeking (17.4) squared circle transit. Sent by Paolo Davit and headed "Upper Zambesi Mission". Also 1898 (25 Feb.) British Bechuanaland 1d. postal stationery card from Palapye to Morija cancelled by "676" barred oval with Palachwe, Khamas Town (26.2), Kimberley (1.3) and Bloemfontein (2.3) c.d.s., the reverse bearing Mafeking (5.3) and Morija (6.3) c.d.s. Written by Paolo Davit to Rev. A. Casalis at Morija. A good pair of cards from this writer, scarce Bechuanaland stationery cards sent by the P.M.S. (2 cards.) The sender of these cards was Paolo Davit, who had been stationed at Sefula. He had travelled to Palapye (where he sent these cards) to obtain supplies but fell gravely ill and had to return home. It appears that, after falling ill, Davit planned to move the P.M.S. missions in Basutoland, hence his card to M. Alfred Casalis at Morija. Thought to be the earliest BSA card used by the P.M.S. 1898 (21 July) card from Eugene Beguin to Switzerland, cancelled Bulawayo (22.8) with Neuchatel arrival c.d.s. (18.9) with tax handstamp and Swiss 10c. postage due. Beguin, who had been stationed at Nalolo with his wife from 1894 writes, Here we are at Kazungula for our Conference. Having left Nalolo on 30 June we arrived here on 14 July. God be thanked, we are well ...". There are a few age marks.
