# INTRODUCTIONS

I have been a stamp collector for over 70 years but in 1990 when I visited Stampex UK at Alexandra Palace, and amongst the dealers trying to keep the rain leaking from the glass ceiling off their booths, I met Dickon Pollard who convinced me that I should narrow my interests and concentrate on a more manageable timeframe. So with urging from Dickon I chose the KGVI period and have been enjoying it ever since. Japanese Occupation stamps seemed awfully difficult but eventually Peter Singer convinced me to put some of my efforts into this complex area and sent me his catalogue. I was hooked, and thanks to both of these individuals I have had great fun in combing the stamp world for objects of my obsession and I have learned a lot about a part of the world I knew very little about.

Of course, I was interested in stamps but when I decided to be an exhibitor I needed to add some postal history to enter the traditional exhibition category so I acquired cards, stationery and letters to enhance the 'stamp' portion of the exhibit. Exhibiting also led me to the conclusion that material like this needs to be certified, not only for the exhibition judges to be certain, but for peace of mind that what I procured was not fraudulent. So this Spink catalogue is not only an auction document but a reference of the variations that can be collected to broaden the scope of what is listed in the major catalogues.

However, all good things must come to an end and I am now at a stage in life where I need to downsize and share what I have accumulated (with adherence to authenticity of the material) with others. Enjoy.

# THE TOM GOSSE COLLECTION OF THE JAPANESE OCCUPATION ISSUES OF BRITISH SOUTH EAST ASIA

This is undoubtedly the finest collection of these issues to come on the open market. Formed over forty years, Tom has managed to acquire items from all the major collections that have been sold including Milo Rowell, Dr. Cheah Way Mun, Dr. Ian Matheson, Gerald Davis, William Bennett and Alan Meech to name but a few.

7The collection not only covers Malaya but also Burma and Borneo with Brunei, Labuan, North Borneo and Sarawak.

What stands out is its completeness with very few S.G. numbers missing. For example, in the single frame chops, Tom has tried to collect all the known colours and their different types for each state and value, and in the Selangor whether the handstamp was struck left to right or right to left.

In the Burma, one will find a wonderful selection of the different "Peacock" overprints and studies of the "cracked plate" and "pin" flaws.

Virtually all the major errors are to be found, whether it be inverts, doubles or omitted in pair (or larger) of normal overprint.

This will be a once in a lifetime to acquire these rare and difficult stamps, or the perfect opportunity to begin a new collecting area.

Articles have been written that show that this overprint was only used on postal stationery and that these stamps were created in 1945, thus are bogus. 



Note: A copy of an unpublished note by U Aung Myint (Lim Ping Hong) is among the Gerald Davis papers. It appears to have been written in the early 1980s.

"The 30c. original printing is in deep blue-green on thick white wove paper, the figure and "c" are uniform, with clean cut perforations. The reprint stamp is in yellow-green and the figure and "c" are different, with the paper slightly thin.

The error of colour is in indigo. It was discovered by U Tun Tin while he was in charge of the stamp printing. He noticed that about one hundred sheets of the 30c. were printed in indigo instead of blue-green. He took a few sheets for a record and ordered the remaining stamps destroyed. It occurred that the printer forgot to mix the yellow ink with indigo. In early 1945 U Tun Tin gave me a dozen of these stamps of error colour in exchange with my peacock stamps. For nearly forty years I have never seen this error of colour variety listed in any catalogue".







The Dart. The long feather running to the S.E. ends in a paddle shape.

The Box. Is narrower than usual and longer—3½ mm., not 3 mm.

Character 3. What is usually a small rectangle has the bottom line pointing north of east, not east.



### TYPE C


Frame, 121 mm, by 181 mm. Shoulders a little rounder than B.

The B. Small, fat and feminine, measuring more across the bottom than the shoulders.

This is the only B without even a vestige of a tail.

The Box. The western side is not vertical but points S.W. instead of south. This feature is peculiar to this type.

The P is as large but rounder than that of type B.



### TYPE D

Frame. 13 by 19 mm. High-shouldered and thick, being \( \frac{1}{2} \) instead of the usual \( \frac{1}{2} \) mm.

The B is angular with its lower loop long and almost an isosceles triangle.

The E has all bars pointing north-east instead of east.

The P is small and the lower part of the head is hooked.

The Box is open at both ends and the western side is longer than the eastern side. See also type F.

The Piano. The "notes on the keyboard" are on a rising line, not a straight line, and grow thicker as they move to the right,

The Dart. The vertical has a small foot on the west side. See type F.

### TYPE E

This type is often confused with type H and still oftener with types L or M.

The differences are:

The B is rounded; that of type H pointed. The "notes on the piano" are dots, those of H sloping dashes.

The vertical stroke of the Dart is not continued beyond the top horizontal; in H it is.

The E is narrow, with the second arm above the middle; in H the E is broad and the arms equally spaced.

The Box is open at the south-west corner; in H it is closed.

The frame is round-shouldered; that of H is high-shouldered.

In type L the head of P is lower than the head of E and it has a long tail. In type E the two letters are level and the P has a short tail.

In type L the two feathers of the dart on the eastern side converge. In type E the feathers are parallel.

In type L the frame is high-shouldered; in E it is round-shouldered.

With type M the chief difference is the extra width, 13 mm. in M as against 12½ in E. There are small differences in most characters. The Box of M is shallower, the long feather of the dart ends in a paddle instead of a hook and the upright projects above the top horizontal line. Other points appear when the two types are placed side by side.



#### TYPE F

Frame, 13 by 19 mm. High-shouldered.

The B long and narrow. The top is nearly an isosceles triangle. The bottom half is hooked.

The Piano. The top bar points north of east.

The other three bars are level. The "notes" are very large and sloping dashes.


The Kite. This is open on the west side, a feature which is peculiar to this type. The small kite repeats this peculiarity.

The Box. Open at bottom of both ends as in type D. The vertical line on the west is longer than the similar line on the east side.

The E. The top and middle bars point north of east; the bottom bar is horizontal.

The P. The head is not a loop so much as an irregular four-sided figure.

The Dart. The vertical line has a small foot, but on the east side. See D.



#### TYPE H

Frame, 121 by 19 mm. High-shouldered.

The B. Very pointed in perfect copies and rather like Cupid's bow.

The Piano. The "notes" are very strong sloping dashes quite unlike the dots of type E.

The Dart. The vertical line projects above the horizontal line, which it does not in type E.

The Box. This is complete, closed all round instead of being open at one or both ends.

The EP. The E is broad, as in types B and C, but the P is small.

#### TYPE L

Frame, 121 by 181 mm. High-shouldered.

The Dart. The vertical line projects above the horizontal very markedly. One unique feature of the type is that on the east side the feathers converge instead of being parallel. In copies from the worn chop this is still more noticeable.

The Box. The vertical line projects below the bottom horizontal line.

The P has an unusually long tail and the top is lower than the top of the E, though the difference in height is not great as in type A.

#### TYPE M

Frame. 13 by 19 mm. Round-shouldered.

The B is very much like that of type E, the difference being easier to see than to describe.

"Kyoku". In character 3 the vertical line at right angles to the longest horizontal is longer than on E. The detached box seems to be slightly rounded at the east end.

The E. The top bar points slightly north of east.

The Piano. The three top bars are shorter than those of type E. It is worth noting that this character is rarely found complete—except on Johore postage dues—but more often appears with what looks like four notes on the keyboard instead of the usual three.\* This appearance is perhaps caused by damage to the vertical at right angles to the long horizontal.

The Dart. The vertical line does project above the horizontal line but so little that it often looks like a small bump.

The Box is unusually shallow and a great help to recognition. It is open at both ends although this is not always apparent.

The observant reader will have noticed that the letters G, I, J and K are missing from the list of types. G, J and K were allotted to three "extra" types which appear to be genuine but are still under examination, and the letter "I" was omitted because it is too like the figure "I".







4.10.3 Lots with this symbol (೨) indicate that a party has provided Spink with an irrevocable bid on the Lot that will be executed during the sale at a value that ensures that the Lot will sell. The irrevocable bidder, who may bid in excess of the irrevocable bid, will be compensated based on his bid in the event he or she is not the successful bidder or may receive a fixed fee in the event he or she is the successful bidder. If the irrevocable bidder is the successful bidder, the fixed fee for providing the irrevocable bid may be netted against the irrevocable bidder's obligation to pay the full purchase price for the Lot. If the irrevocable bid is not secured until after the printing of the auction catalogue, a pre-sale announcement will be made indicating that there is an irrevocable bid on the Lot.

contact us at chairmanoffice@spink.com. Typically, only some of the Lots with an estimate, which must exceed £100,000 or equivalent in other currencies are open to irrevocable bids.

#### 4 11 The Auctioneer's Discretion

The auctioneer has the right at his absolute discretion to refuse any bid to advance the bidding in such manner as he may decide to withdraw or divide any Lot, to combine any two or more Lots and, in the case of error or dispute, to put an item up for bidding again.

- 4.12.1 Subject to the auctioneer's discretion, the striking of his hammer marks the acceptance of the highest bid, provided always that such bid is higher than the Reserve (where applicable), and the conclusion of a contract for sale between you and the Seller.
- 4.12.2 The highest bid at the closing time of the timed auction will be the successful bid and the price will be the hammer price and this will be a conclusion of a contract for sale between you and the Seller. All lots sold in the timed auction are subject to charges per section 5 and all clauses of these terms and conditions.

#### 4.13 After Sale Arrangements

If you enter into any private sale agreements for any Lot with the Seller within 60 days of the auction, we, as exclusive agents of the Seller reserve the right to charge you the applicable Buyer's Premium in accordance with these Terms and Conditions, and the Seller a commission in accordance with the terms of the Seller's agreement.

## 4.14 Return of Lot and cancellation of sale

- 4.14.1 Once your bid has been accepted for a Lot then you are liable to 4.1 Once your bid has been accepted for a Lot then you are liable to pay for that Lot in accordance with these Terms and Conditions. If there are any problems with a Lot then you must notify us within 7 days of receipt of the Lot, specifying the nature of the problem. Please note that an auction sale is not an approval sale. Lots examined by you (or your representative) prior to the sale, Lots for which we have provided condition reports and Lots purchased by floor bidders (including bidders executing commission bids on behalf of other parties) may not be returned and a cancellation of the sale and refund sought except in the case of Forgery in accordance with clause 5.13. below. We may then request that the Lot is returned to us for inspection. Save as set out in clause 5.13 below. We may then request that the Lot is returned to us for inspection. Save as set out in clause 5.13, the cancellation of the sale of any Lot and the refund of the corresponding purchase price is entirely at our sole discretion. We will not exercise that discretion if the Lot is not received by us in the same condition that it was in at the auction date (for the avoidance of doubt including but not limited to any item which has undergone any cleaning, restorative, conservation work, reperforating, pressing, re-gumming or having been taken out of the third party holder after the item has been sold to you shall not be considered as being returned in the same condition as the auction date).
- 4.14.2 No Lot may be returned on account of condition if the condition 4.2 No Lot may be returned on account of condition if the condition was stated by a third party grading company (including, but not limited to PCGS, NGC, ANACS, ICG, PMG, WBG, Legacy Currency Grading) and which conflicts with our condition report or statement of opinion. As stated above at clause 3.2.2, except in the case of manifest error, our condition report and/or opinion stated at the time of the sale shall take precedence over any condition report or third party obtained by you from a third party.
- 4.14.3 No Lot identified as containing any NFT may be returned or is eligible for any refund once the NFT has been transferred to the Digital Wallet instructed by the Buyer. No warranty stated in clause 5.13.1 is given for such Lot.
- 4.14.4 In the event that a buyer, following a sale, submits any Philatelic Item(s) (including being part of a Lot) for expertising without our knowledge and no extension has been requested or agreed, then in the event that the certificate indicates any material fault in the Philatelic Item(s) not described by us, we shall have sole discretion as to whether or not any refund (whether in part or in full) is made to the buyer. No refunds will be considered in the event that any submissions are made to us later than 6 (six) years from the date of sale.

#### AFTER THE AUCTION

# Buyer's Premium and other charges

In addition to the Hammer Price, you must pay us the Buyer's Premium at a rate of 22.5% of the final Hammer price of each Lot, a fee for using a third party bidding platform and postage charge and a fee for paying by card. Any Lot identified as containing an NFT is subject to the Buyer's Premium at a rate of 25% of the final Hammer Price, postage charge and in certain situations a fee for paying by card. When the destination country's authorities require Spink to collect any import duties, taxes, safety and any additional corts connected to the stimment. Spink reserves. tariffs and any additional costs connected to the shipment, Spink reserves the right to update the invoice accordingly.

## Value Added Tax

Other than in respect of Zero-rated Lots (o) VAT is chargeable on the Hammer price and the Buyer's premium of daggered  $(\dagger)$  and  $(\Omega)$  Lots at the standard rate (currently 20%), and on Lots marked (x) at the reduced rate (currently 5% on the Hammer price and 20% on the Buyer's premium). VAT on Margin scheme Lots (identified by the absence of any VAT symbol next to the Lot number) is payable at 20% on the Buyer's premium only.

#### VAT Refunds - Buyers from outside the UK 5.3

5.3.1 As we remain liable to account for VAT on all Lots unless they have been exported outside the UK within 3 months of the date of sale, you will be asked to deposit all amounts of VAT invoiced. However, if a

- Spink nominated shipper is instructed, then any refundable VAT will not be collected. In all other cases refunds due will be made when valid proof of export is provided. For avoidance of doubt, please note refunds cannot be made to private Buyers, when Lots are bought for private use, if exported by the Buyer.
- 5.3.2 If you are registered as a collectibles business outside the UK and the Lots are invoiced to this business, are not for private use, if you export the Lots outside the UK yourself or appoint your own agent you must obtain shipping documents from the Shipping Department for which a charge of £50 will be made.
- 5.3.3 Where required, we can advise you on how to export Lots as a specific form of export evidence is required. Where we advise you on the export of the Lots, please be aware that the ultimate responsibility in respect of obtaining a valid proof of export will lie with you and we will not be responsible for your failure to obtain such proof.
- 5.3.4 If you export the Lot, subject to par. 5.3.2., you must return the valid proof of export to us within 3 months of the date of sale. If you fail to return the valid proof of export to us within such period and you have not already accounted to us for the VAT, you will be liable to us for the full amount of the VAT due on such Lot and we shall be entitled to invoice you for this sum.
- 5.3.5 To apply for a refund of any VAT paid, the valid proof of export must be sent to our Shipping Department clearly marked 'VAT Refund' within 3 months of the date of sale. No payment will be made where the total amount of VAT refundable is less than £50 and Spink will charge £50 for each refund processed.
- 5.3.6 Where a Lot is included within the Margin Scheme and Auctioneers' Scheme and valid evidence of export from the UK is produced within 3 months of the date of sale, the VAT on Buyer's Premium may be refunded.
- 5.3.7 Where the Lot is marked as a Daggered (†) Lot the VAT charged on the Hammer Price may be refunded where evidence of valid export from the UK is produced within 3 months of the date of sale. A refund of VAT charged on the Buyer's Premium can also be made on receipt of proof of registration as a collectibles business.
- 5.3.8 Where the Lot is marked as an Omega  $(\Omega)$  Lot or an Import VAT (x) Lot and valid evidence of export from the UK is produced within 3 months of the date of sale, the VAT charged on both the Hammer Price and Buyer's Premium may be refunded.
- 5.3.9 Lot marked as Investment Gold (g) is exempt from VAT on Hammer price. A refund of VAT charged on the Buyer's Premium can be made on receipt of proof of registration as a collectibles business and where valid evidence of export from the UK is produced within 3 months of the date of sale.

#### Payment

- 5.4.1 You must provide us with your full name and permanent address and, if so requested, details of the bank from which any payments to and, it so requested, details of the bank from which any payments to us will be made. You must pay the full amount due (comprising the Hammer Price, the Buyer's Premium, a fee for using a third party bidding platform, any applicable VAT and any applicable duties, taxes and tariffs required by the customs authorities of the final destination of the Lot to be paid upon despatch, in the instances where Spink is arranging shipment) within seven days after the date of the sale even if the Lot in question has been submitted for expertising and/or is awaiting a certificate to be issued. This applies even if you wish to export the Lot and an export licence is (or may be) required.
- 5.4.1.1 We shall hold all proceeds of sale until such time as any expertising and/or issue of certificates and/or export licence has been finalised.
- 5.4.1.2 In the event that the certificate indicates a material adverse issue with regard to the item in the Lot in question and/or the export licence is refused, we shall make an appropriate refund to the buyer. 5.4.2 You will not acquire title to the Lot until
- - (i) all amounts due have been paid in full. This includes instances where special arrangements were made for release of Lot prior to full settlement.
  - (ii) the NFT has been transferred to your Digital Wallet if the Lot you bought is identified as containing NFT, at this point the sale of the Lot becomes unconditional and incapable of any refund for any
- reason.
  5.4.3 Payment should be made in sterling by one of the following methods:
  - Direct bank transfer to our account details of which are set out on the invoice. All bank charges shall be met by you. Please ensure that your client number is noted on the transfer.
  - By cheque or bank draft made payable to Spink and Son Ltd and sent to Spink at 69 Southampton Row, Bloomsbury, London WC1B 4ET. Please note that the processing charges for payments made by cheques or bank drafts drawn on a non-U.K bank shall be met by you. Please ensure that the remittance slip printed at the bottom of the invoice is enclosed with your payment.
  - By Visa or Mastercard. All Corporate cards regardless of origin and Consumer debit and credit cards issued outside the UK are subject to a fee of 3%. For all card payments there are limits to the amounts we will accept depending on the type of card being used and whether or not the cardholder is present.
- By cryptocurrency, if we have indicated in the catalogue or by a written announcement or notice prior to the sale of a Lot identified as containing any NFT that such cryptocurrency payment may be made by you and will be accepted by us.

  5.4.4 Payments should be made by the registered buyer and not by third
- parties, unless it has been agreed at the time of registration that you are acting as an agent on behalf of a third party.

#### Invoices

Invoices may consist of one or more pages and will show: Zero rated Lots (o); no symbol Lots sold under the Margin Scheme and Auctioneers'

Scheme; Lots marked (g) special scheme Investment Gold; Daggered Lots  $(\dagger)$ , imported Lots marked (x) and  $(\Omega)$ .

#### Collection of Purchases

- 5.6.1 Unless specifically agreed to the contrary, we shall retain Lots purchased until all amounts due to us, or to the Spink Group, have been paid in full. Buyers will be required to pay for their Lots when they wish to take possession of the same, which must be within 7 days of the date of the sale, unless prior arrangements have been made with Spink. Without prior agreement, Lots will not be released until cleared funds are received with regard to payments made by cheque.
- 5.6.2 Unless we notify you to the contrary, items retained by us will be covered in accordance with our policy which is available for inspection at our offices from the date of sale for a period of seven days or until the time of collection, whichever is sooner. After seven days or from the time of collection, whichever is the earlier, the Lot will be entirely
- 5.6.3 Our policy will not cover and we are unable to accept responsibility for damage caused by woodworm, changes in atmospheric conditions or acts of terrorism.

We are not able to notify successful bidders by telephone. While Invoices are sent out by email or mail after the auction we do not accept responsibility for notifying you of the result of your bid. You are requested to contact us by telephone or in person as soon as possible after the auction to obtain details of the outcome of your bids to avoid incurring charges for late payment.

# Packing and handling

- 5.8.1 We shall use all reasonable endeavours to take care when handling and packing a purchased Lot but remind you that after seven days or from the time of collection, whichever is sooner, the Lot is entirely at your risk. Our postage charges are set out at the back of the catalogue.
- 5.8.2 It is the responsibility of the Buyer to be aware of any Import Duties, Taxes and Tariffs that may be incurred upon importation to the final destination. Spink will not accept return of any package in order to avoid these duties, taxes or tariffs. The onus is also on the Buyer to be aware of any Customs import restrictions that prohibit the importation of certain collectibles. Spink will not accept return of the Lot(s) under these circumstances. Spink will not accept responsibility for Lot(s) seized or destroyed by Customs.
- 5.8.3 If the Buyer requires delivery of the Lot to an address other than the invoice address this will be carried out at the discretion of Spink.

# Recommended packers and shippers

If required our shipping department may arrange shipment as your agent. Although we may suggest carriers if specifically requested, our suggestions are made on the basis of our general experience of such parties in the past and we are not responsible to any person to whom we have made a recommendation for the acts or omissions of the third parties concerned.

- Remedies for non-payment or failure to collect purchases 5.10.1 If you fail to make payment within seven days of your stipulated payment date set out in your invoice, we shall be entitled to exercise one or more of the following rights or remedies:
  - 5.10.1.1 to charge interest at the rate of 2% per month compound interest, calculated on a daily basis, from the date the full amount
  - 5.10.1.2 to set off against any amounts which the Spink Group may owe you in any other transaction the outstanding amount remaining unpaid by you;
  - 5.10.1.3 we may keep hold of all or some of your Lots or other property in the possession of the Spink Group until you have paid all the amounts you owe us or the Spink Group, even if the unpaid amounts do not relate to those Lots or other property. Following fourteen days' notice to you of the amount outstanding and remaining unpaid, the Spink Group shall have the right to arrange the sale of such Lots or other property. We shall apply the proceeds in discharge of the amount outstanding to us or the Spink Group, and pay any balance to you;
  - 5.10.1.4 where several amounts are owed by you to the Spink Group in respect of different transactions, to apply any amount paid to discharge any amount owed in respect of any particular transaction, whether or not you so direct;
  - 5.10.1.5 to reject at any future auction any bids made by you or on your behalf or obtain a deposit from you before accepting any bids.
- 5.10.2 If you fail to make payment within thirty-five days, we shall in addition be entitled:
  - 5.10.2.1 to cancel the sale of the Lot or any other item sold to you at the same or any other auction;
  - 5.10.2.2 to arrange a resale of the Lot, publicly or privately, and, if this results in a lower price being obtained, claim the balance from you together with all reasonable costs including a 20% seller's commission, expenses, damages, legal fees, commissions and premiums of whatever kind associated with both sales or otherwise, ncurred in connection with your failure to make payment;
- 5.10.2.3 when reselling the Lot, place a notice in our catalogue stating that you successfully purchased the Lot at auction but have subsequently failed to pay the Hammer Price of the Lot; or 5.10.2.4 take any other appropriate action as we deem fit.
  5.10.3 If you fail to collect within fourteen days after the sale, whether or
- not payment has been made, you will be required
  - 5.10.3.1 to pay a storage charge of £2 per item per day plus any
  - additional handling cost that may apply.
    5.10.3.2 you will not be entitled to collect the Lot until all outstanding charges are met, together with payment of all other amounts due to us.

#### 5.11 Use of Default Information

If you fail to make payment for a Lot in accordance with these Terms and Conditions:

- we reserve the right to refuse you the right to make bids for any future auction irrespective of whether previous defaults have been 5.11.1 settled; and
- 5.11.2 you acknowledge that we may (as necessary for our legitimate interests those of other auctioneers and live bidding platforms in referencing customers and avoiding customer defaults) disclose details of such default to other auctioneers and live bidding platforms, which will include your name, address, nature of the default and the date of the default.

Auctioneers or live bidding platforms who receive details of the default may rely on such information when deciding whether to enter into a transaction with you in the future.

#### 5.12 Export Licence

- 5.12.1 If required we can, at our discretion, advise you on the detailed provisions of the export licensing regulations. Where we advise you in relation to export licensing regulations the ultimate responsibility in respect of any export will lie with you and we will not be responsible for your failure to apply for any necessary licences.

  5.12.2 If the Lot is going to be hand carried by you, you may be required
- to produce a valid export licence to us or sign a waiver document stating that a licence will be applied for.

  5.12.3 You should always check whether an export licence is required before exporting. Export licences are usually obtained within two or
- three weeks but delays can occur.
- 5.12.4 Unless otherwise agreed by us in writing, the fact that you wish to apply for an export licence does not affect your obligation to make payment within seven days nor our right to charge interest on late
- payment.

  5.12.5 If you request that we apply for an export licence on your behalf, we shall be entitled to recover from you our disbursements and out of pocket expenses in relation to such application, together with any
- 5.12.6 We will not be obliged to rescind a sale nor to refund any interest or other expenses incurred by you where payment is made by you despite the fact that an export licence is required.

# 5.13 Refund in the case of Forgery

- 5.13.1 Unless otherwise described by us, and subject to the rest of this clause 5.13, we guarantee the authenticity of a Lot (other than a miscellaneous Lot, or Lot containing an NFT or item not described in the catalogue) offered for sale by us for: (1) a period of 10 (ten) years from the date of sale for coins and banknotes; and (2) a period of 6
- (six) years for all other items. 5.13.2 If, after the sale of a Lot, you reasonably believe an item in a Lot (other than a miscellaneous item not described in the catalogue) is not
- (other than a miscellaneous item not described in the catalogue) is not authentic and is a Forgery, you must:

  5.13.2.1 notify us within 7 days of becoming aware the item is a Forgery providing a written explanation and evidence obtained by you that the item is a Forgery. ("Forgery Notice");

  5.13.2.2 unless otherwise agreed by us in writing, return the item to us within 14 days from the Forgery Notice, in the same condition as at the action date (for the avoidance of doubt including but not limited.)
- the auction date (for the avoidance of doubt including but not limited to any item which has undergone any cleaning, restorative, conservation work, reperforating, pressing, re-gumming or having been taken out of the third party holder after the item has been sold to you shall not be considered as being returned in the same condition as the auction date)
- 5.13.2.3 promptly provide to us such evidence as we may request that you are able to transfer good title to us or the Seller as we direct, free from any third party claims.
- 5.13.3 Following receipt of the information set out above and the item, we will review and notify you if we agree with your belief the item is not authentic and is a Forgery. You shall cooperate with us at all times and provide such further information and assistance as we may reasonably require for us to carry out our review. Failure to adhere to the above conditions shall mean we shall not be under any obligation to continue the process of review or refund any money paid by you (if
- applicable).

  5.13.4 Following our review, if we agree the item is not authentic and is a Forgery we shall notify you in writing. The sale of the Lot to which the item relates shall be rescinded and the amount paid by you refunded to you. For the avoidance of doubt we will only be required to pay you the amount actually paid by you for the Lot concerned and you shall have no claim for interest. Except as otherwise stated in this clause, we shall not be liable to you for any costs, expenses or damages (whether direct, indirect, special or consequential) incurred or suffered by you in respect of any Lot, which breaches our guarantee and is a Fórgery.
- 5.13.5 Please note an item shall not be considered a Forgery by us where any of the following circumstances apply:
  5.13.5.1 the catalogue description or saleroom notice of the item at the auction date corresponded to the generally accepted opinion of scholars or experts at that time, or fairly indicated that there was a conflict of spiritual correspondent.
- conflict of opinions, or 5.13.5.2 it can be demonstrated that the item is a Forgery only by means of either a scientific process not generally accepted for use until after publication of the catalogue or a process which at the date of the auction was unreasonably expensive or impracticable or likely to have caused damage to the Lot; or 5.13.5.3 it can be demonstrated that the item is a Forgery only by mean
- of adducing information and/or material which were not available at the date of the auction.
- 5.13.6 The benefit of the guarantee at clause 5.13.1 is not capable of being transferred, and is solely for the benefit of the person to whom the original invoice was made out by us in respect of the Lot when

sold and who, since the sale, has remained the owner of the Lot

without disposing of any interest in it to any third party.
5.13.7 We shall be entitled to rely on any scientific or other process to establish that the Lot is not a Forgery, whether or not such process was used or in use at the date of the auction.

#### LIABILITY

Nothing in these Terms and Conditions limits or excludes our liability for:

death or personal injury resulting from negligence; or

any damage or liability incurred by you as a result of our fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation.

## USE OF YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

We will use the personal information you provide to us as set out in our privacy notice (available at https://spink.com/privacy-policy) and in

7.1.1 process the bids you make on Lots (whether successful or

otherwise) and other auction related services we provide;
7.1.2 process your payment relating to a successful purchase of a Lot which includes submitting certain personal information to the Blockchain in respect of purchases of NFTs using a Digital Wallet;

7.1.3 arrange for delivery of any Lot you purchase, which will include passing your details to shipping providers and, on overseas deliveries, to customs where they make enquiries regarding the Lot and to the Blockchain where you purchase NFT(s);

7.1.4 inform you about similar products or services that we provide, but

you may stop receiving these at any time by contacting us. In accordance with clause 4.2, we may pass your information to credit reference agencies in order to obtain credit checks from them, and they may keep a record of any search that they do.

In accordance with clause 5.11, where you default on making payment for a Lot in accordance with these terms and conditions we may disclose details of such default to other auctioneers and live bidding platforms.

We are also working closely with third parties (including, for example, other auctioneers and live bidding platforms) and may receive information about ou from them.

Where you provide us with personal information about other individuals, you must ensure that your provision of that information is compliant with applicable data protection law.

#### COPYRIGHT

We shall have the right (on a non-exclusive basis) to photograph, video or otherwise produce an image of the Lot. All rights in such an image will belong to us, and we shall have the right to use it in whatever way we see

The copyright in all images, illustrations and written material relating to a Lot is and shall remain at all times our property and we shall have the right to use it in whatever way we see fit. You shall not use or allow anyone else 8 2 to use such images, illustrations or written material without our prior written consent. This is separate and distinct to any copyright inherent in any item of any Lot which is to be assigned to you as part of a Lot containing an NFT.

## VAT

You shall give us all relevant information about your VAT status and that of the Lot to ensure that the correct information is printed in the catalogues. Once printed, the information cannot be changed. If we incur any unforeseen cost or expense as a result of the information being incorrect, you will reimburse to us on demand the full amount incurred.

## 10 NOTICES

All notices given under these Terms and Conditions may be served personally, sent by 1st class post, or faxed to the address given to the sender by the other party. Any notice sent by post will be deemed to have been received on the second working day after posting or, if the addressee is overseas, on the fifth working day after posting. Any notice sent by fax or served personally will be deemed to be delivered on the first working day following despatch.

# 11 ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

The following provisions of this clause 11 shall apply only if you are acting for the purposes of your business.

Limitation of Liability
Subject to clause 6, we shall not be liable, whether in tort (including for negligence) or breach of statutory duty, contract, misrepresentation or otherwise for any:

otherwise for any:

11.1.1 loss of profits, loss of business, depletion of goodwill and/or similar losses, loss of anticipated savings, loss of goods, loss of contract, loss of use, loss of corruption of data or information; or

11.1.2 any special, indirect, consequential or pure economic loss, costs,

damages, charges or expenses.

11.1.3 You acknowledge that we are not technology or data experts and that NFTs are not issued, minted or tokenised by us. Furthermore, you acknowledge that NFTs are a new type of asset and NFTs, Smart Contracts and Blockchain transactions are subject to inherent technical and financial risks which you accept, and that the regulatory environment in relation to NFTs (over which we have no control) is uncertain and developing constantly.

11.2 Severability

If any part of these Terms and Condition is found by any court to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, that part may be discounted and the rest of the conditions shall continue to be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Force majeure

We shall have no liability to you if we are prevented from, or delayed in performing, our obligations under these Terms and Conditions or from carrying on our business by acts, events, omissions or accidents beyond our reasonable control, including (without limitation) strikes, lock-outs or other industrial disputes (whether involving our workforce or the

workforce of any other party), failure of a utility service or transport or communications network, blockchain failure or delay, act of God, war, riot, civil commotion, malicious damage, compliance with any law or governmental order, rule, regulation or direction, accident, breakdown of plant or machinery, fire, flood, storm or default of suppliers or subcontractors.

#### 11.4 Waiver

11.4.1 A waiver of any right under these Terms and Conditions is only 4.1 A waver of any right under these Terms and Conditions is only effective if it is in writing and it applies only to the circumstances for which it is given. No failure or delay by a party in exercising any right or remedy under these Terms and Conditions or by law shall constitute a waiver of that (or any other) right or remedy, nor preclude or restrict its further exercise. No single or partial exercise of such right or remedy shall preclude or restrict the further exercise of

that (or any other) right or remedy.

11.4.2 Unless specifically provided otherwise, rights arising under these Terms and Conditions are cumulative and do not exclude rights provided by law.

11.5 Law and Jurisdiction
