Months later, Multan was besieged. On January 18, 1849 EIC sappers exploded three large mines causing heavy losses and destroying large sections of the city walls. On January 22, Diwan Mulraj and his 550 remaining soldiers surrendered. The British seized Mulraj's treasury valued at 3 Million British Pounds, a vast sum for the time, while the EIC troops looted the devasted city. Extremely Fine.






