An already rare first year of issue in superb original condition with fresh colours and strong signature. PMG Census SINGLE TOP POP with second place being a mere 35 (without EPQ). One of the only two examples with EPQ (Exceptional Paper Quality), with the other being 30EPQ which was sold at Spink March 2024 for HKD114,000 (inc.premium). Best graded example known for the 1927 issue. A must have for any vintage collectors

PMG Census one of only two TOP POP example with EPQ designation. Early type that is rarely seen in such lovely and fresh condition! Consecutive with next lot, not often seen as a pair. A lower grade example of PMG 55EPQ was sold in Spink auction March 2024 for HKD72,000 (inc.premium)

Last issue date for the handsigned type. With original paper and bright vivid colours. And not to mention a large clean hand signature. PMG Census second highest grade example with EPQ designation. Early type that is rarely seen in such lovely and fresh condition! Consecutive with previous lot, not often seen as a pair. A PMG 55EPQ example was sold in Spink March 2024 for HKD72,000 (inc.premium)

The Chartered Bank of India, Australia and China, \$500, pattern, undated (ca.1911-1912), without serial numbers, purple-red, black and dark yellow, supported arms at upper centre, denomination at each corner and within left and right borders, central vignette of sailing sampans and junk boat against fortress walls and pagoda, reverse blue and black, bank building at centre, 'SPECIMEN' printed in red diagonally twice on the obverse, hole punch cancelled, (Pick 46s), PMG 53 About Uncirculated (Pinholes). This note is a pattern for the issue of 1912. It was prepared either late in 1911 or early in 1912. At the time of preparation it was not yet decided whether the notes would be hand-signed and dated. Thus a unique pattern. Colloquially known as the 'Spider Web' because of the geometric design at centre, this type is one of the most iconic and coveted Hong Kong banknotes. Ultra rare in any form, this note is in superb quality and will be fiercely contested for without doubt. Must have for serious collectors

As the last note in the series - first prefix fancy serial number notes are usually kept at bank archive and used for exhibition purposes. A rare opportunity for serious lucky number collectors!

Similar examples had been included in exhibitions in Macau.
