Private Treaty



1851 Laid Paper, 6d. Slate-Violet Strip of Three

1851 laid paper, 6d. slate-violet strip of three (left stamp touched at left and cut-into at foot), each with central target cancel on 1851 (1.12) from New Carlisle Gaspe to France, showing despatch datestamp, manuscript "15", framed "COLONIES/&C.ART 12" and Calais entry c.d.s. (23.12) in red and, on reverse, Chatham (in blue), Peticodiac and Sackville (New Brunswick) transit datestamps. The largest recorded multiple of the laid paper 6d. on cover.

Note: The franking paid the 3d. overland rate to Nova Scotia and the colonial packet rate of 15d. currency from Halifax to the U.K. The mail was closed at Sackville exchange office and the letter carried on vessel "Asia" which arrived at Liverpool on 20th December. This is the only known cover to a foreign country using this routing through the Maritimes.

1851 laid paper, 6d. slate-violet pair with clear to large margins indistinctly cancelled on 1851 (18 May) entire from Toronto to St. John, New Brunswick, showing despatch datestamp with, on reverse, Quebec, Woodstock and arrival datestamps; small piece missing at top of face panel. A rare multiple and the only recorded cover paying the quadruple letter rate to New Brunswick via overland route.

1852 thin wove paper, 3d. orange-red vertical strip of three, vertical pair and a single (just into at left), each with central target cancel on 1854 (14 Sept.) entire from Montreal to Hamburg, marked "Per Steamer Baltic", showing red Henry Chapman & Co. firm's h.s., despatch d.s., oval-framed "P", manuscript "4", red London Paid transit c.d.s. (28.9) and, on reverse, arrival datestamp (30.9); some small faults but still attractive. The only recorded fully prepaid cover to Hamburg carried by the U.S. Packet Line. Firby Certificate (2005)

1852 3d. red and 6d. slate-violet used on G.B. 1d. stationery envelope from Goderich to England, each with concentric rings cancels, showing manuscript "1d", despatch c.d.s. and, on reverse, London U.C., Liverpool and arrival datestamps; the envelope with some light staining yet still a fine and most unusual combination cover. Note: Apparently the sender was convinced this franking would match the 10d. letter rate to UK by Cunard Line, which the postmaster apparently at first glance also accepted and stamped the cover "8d Stg" (=10d.) but then cancelled this marking by two strikes of the target cancel and rated the cover as "d1" due, not accepting the British envelope.

1852 3d. deep red lower right corner pair [99-100] from Pane A showing small portion of [10] from Pane B, tied by light target cancels on 1854 (13 Dec.) entire from London to New York, showing despatch datestamp partly overstruck by Suspension Bridge N.Y. datestamp. This is the only known partial interpanneau pair of all pence issues and is considered by many to be one of the most important 3d. items in Canadian philately. B.P.A. Certificate (1997)

1852 3d. brown-red block of six (3x2), each with concentric rings cancel on 1853 (25 June) triple rate envelope (220x102mm.) from Montreal to Philadelphia, showing red despatch c.d.s., curved "PAID" and curved framed "CANADA"; the block slightly cut-into and with small tear at upper left, the envelope with filing folds and tears (partly fixed/repaired). The unique example of a 3d. block of six on cover. Greene Foundation Certificate (1992)

1852-57 7½d. yellow-green (2) plus 3d. red (2) on hard wove paper, all neatly cancelled by 4-ring "1" on 1857 (21 Nov.) double rate mourning envelope registered from Barrie to London, showing despatch datestamp, manuscript "6", straight-line "REGISTERED" and "Crown/REGISTERED" h.s. in red with arrival datestamp (7.12) on reverse. A magnificent and important cover to England carried on the Cunard Line ("Arabia" which departed from New York on 25 November). A superb exhibition showpiece

A rare franking at the "Crimean War" rate prepaid 16d. for service by U.S. Packet (Collins Line) but carried by the less expensive Cunard rate. B.P.A. Certificate (1995)

An attractive franking being one of only two known bearing a ½d. block of six

An important showpiece and the only known registered cover to the U.S. at the 9d. rate



(21.2) and Calais entry d.s. with arrival datestamp on reverse; the address panel partially excised and reinstated. A marvellous franking and one of only two covers recorded at the 12½d. letter rate to France via the Cunard Line (this sent on "Arabia". B.P.A. Certificate (1995)

1857 6d. grey-violet on thick hard paper, a strip of three with small to mainly large margins cancelled by 4-ring "5" on 1859 (2 June) envelope (205x100mm.; slightly reduced at sides) from Brandford to Hamilton, showing despatch c.d.s. with arrival datestamp (3.6) on reverse; some minor creases not affecting the adhesives. A fine cover bearing the largest recorded multiple of this stamp. Greene Foundation Certificate (2002)

(27.3). An extremely rare franking being just one of only two known covers with both existing values on ribbed paper

(2) used with 3d. red and 6d. greenish grey on 1859 (14 Apr.) envelope from Port Rowan to England, all tied by blue target cancels, showing legible despatch c.d.s., red "PAID/LIVERPOOL/BR. PACKET" c.d.s. and, on reverse, Hamilton (15.4) and arrival datestamps; both ½d. and the 3d. with slight creasing where originally affixed over the edge of the envelope, the envelope with minor peripheral wear and a fraction soiled. An attractive three-colour franking and the only recorded Pence issue cover bearing more than two different values

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1857 thick soft paper 6d. reddish purple pair cancelled by 4-ring "51" on 1858 (30 Dec.) envelope registered from Brockville to Chicago, showing despatch c.d.s., straight-line "REGISTERED" and "PAID 3d" handstamps in orange with, on reverse, Windsor and arrival datestamps. The only recorded multiple of the rare 6d., and the only multiple rate registered cover to the U.S. with 3d. registration fee paid in cash

1857 thick soft paper 6d. reddish purple with wove paper ½d. rose (3) and ½d. lilac-rose, each cancelled by 4-ring "50" on 1858 (5 June) envelope from Windsor to Scotland, marked "via St. Lawrence", showing despatch c.d.s., straight-line "MORE TO PAY" and handstruck "2" with, on reverse, Hamilton, Packet Letter Liverpool (20.6), Edinburgh and arrival datestamps; the adhesives cut-into in places and the ½d. lilac-rose lifted and hinged in place. A unique short-paid franking

Note: Covers carried by the Canadian packet of the Allan Line via Quebec required 7½d. postage (6d. Sterling). The postage for covers transported by British Packet (Cunard Line) via New York was 10d. (8d. Sterling). Apparently this cover was originally posted with 7½d. but a mail clerk advised the sender that the letter would not catch the next Canadian packet and that additional postage was required to prepay the letter for the next steamer, it being the British packet (in this case Cunard "Africa"). An error occurred when only an additional ½d. rose-lilac was added making up the 8d. currency instead of the 10d. Sterling. Thus for this route the cover was underpaid and accordingly taxed. This is the only recorded cover showing compliance with the Post Office's "next packet" principle,

A unique multiple franking paying the 6d. letter rate to the U.S. Greene Foundation Certificate (2002)

A remarkable franking of perforated Pence values with the largest recorded multiple of the 6d. on cover, and one of only two covers known at the 12½d. Cunard Line rate to France (this carried on "Arabia").

A spectacular franking with the largest existing multiple of this stamp
